



Minutes of National Level Review Meeting on implementation of Watershed Development Component of Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana 2.0 (WDC-PMKSY 2.0) held with States/UTs on 29<sup>th</sup> April, 2025 under the Chairmanship of Secretary, DoLR at New Delhi

The Department of Land Resources (DoLR) has organized a National Level Review Meeting on implementation of WDC-PMKSY 2.0 under the Chairmanship of Secretary, Department of Land Resources on 29th April, 2025 at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi. The Chairman of SLNAs / Principal Secretary /Secretary along with CEO, SLNA and Senior Officers of States/UTs attended the meeting. The list of participants is enclosed at Annexure - I.

- 2. The Agenda of the Meeting was to review the implementation of WDC-PMKSY 2.0, discuss the plan of action for FY2025-26, implementation of SNA SPARSH, implementation of Watershed Janbhagidari Cup, sharing the best practices by States/UTs, eminent NGOs and Institutes working in the field of Soil & Water Conservation and Springshed Management.
- 3. Joint Secretary (WM) welcomed all the participants and informed the States/UTs that the Secretary, DoLR as well as he has taken a series of Video Conferences during last financial year to review the implementation of scheme and to expedite the expenditure. However, progress was not satisfactory with respect to the expenditure by States in the previous financial year. Hence, he requested States/UTs to ensure the progress as per their plan in the coming quarters. Further, he requested all the States to issue the work orders for all the NRM and Production System activities latest by May, 2025. He presented States/UTs ranking based on expenditure done under the scheme so far. He also instructed that the country-wide expenditure is only 57% which ideally should have been at least 75% at the end of 4<sup>th</sup> year of the scheme.
- 4. Secretary, DoLR in his opening remarks stated that
- (i) During the last year, payment challenges were witnessed due to States not receiving their funds from State Govt. or due to shift from PFMS to SNA Sparsh. Now almost all the States/UTs have shifted to SNA Sparsh. Further, Secretary, DoLR stressed the importance of issuing work orders in a timely manner.
- (ii) Under the scheme, after the issue of work order, no works genrally require more than 2 months time for completion. Hence, requested all the State representatives to speed up the implementation and timely payments in order to ensure timely completion of the WDC-PMKSY2.0 projects.
- (iii) States to coordinate with the State Finance Department and ensure early release of matching State Mother Sanction and faster processing of payment files on SNA Sparsh, as there is no delay in releasing funds from the Centre.
- (iv) Each State has different administrative set up and may be facing certain administrative and technical issues. Hence, advised the States to take DoLR's help to resolve these challenges.





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5. State-wise progress of WDC-PMKSY 2.0 as well as Janbhagidari Cup is summarized in table I below and State specific points discussed during the review meeting are placed below:

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### Andhra Pradesh:

- Due to migration to SNA-SPARSH, February & March month's progress was hampered.
- State expressed State level specific issue in SNA Sparsh, which needs to be resolved by the State.
- State has planned only Rs. 48 lakh towards Janbhagidari. JS (WM) suggested to enhance the amount.
- Detailed Monthly Action Plan has been made for the FY 2025-26 and is being strictly followed upon to achieve progress under both NRM and Production System Components simultaneously.

#### Arunachal Pradesh:

- The works under the scheme have been implemented/ carried out satisfactorily.
- To address the issue in SNA Sparsh regarding mapping with the Ministry, the State is advised to visit the PFMS office in New Delhi.
- State is advised to develop a cluster based horticulture plantation.

#### Assam:

- The state has stated that it has taken remedial measures to expedite the utilization of sanctioned funds and all the necessary intermigration has been completed and ready for faster payment processing.
- State also informed that all the PIAs are trained and they are now competent to use SNA-SPARSH Module.
- JS (WM) advised the State to take more no. of RCC works under Janbhagidari Cup.

### Bihar:

- The CEO of the SLNA also stated that monthly targets have been set for each project. Regular reviews are being conducted by senior officers with district-level officers.
- Additional Secretary, DoLR suggested to revise the month-wise expenditure action plan with a proportionately higher expenditure plan during the initial months.
- Secretary, DoLR expressed his displeasure for not issuing work order for 2000 works and requested to expedite the same.

### Chhattisgarh

 The CEO of the SLNA also stated that due to Model Code of Conduct for Lok-Sabha election, Panchayat and Municipal Elections, the pace of expenditure was low. Now, Districts were directed to speed up the expenditure in a rapid manner.

# Goa:

- State informed that the scheme was implemented for the first time after 21 years. Hence, the formation of a separate cell and the non-availability of sufficient staff in the Watershed Cell are the major issues contributing to the slow pace of expenditure.
- State is advised to prepare and submit an action plan for Rs. 45 crore for FY 2025-26 (State has submitted action plan for Rs. 18 crore).

#### Gujarat:

State informed that remedial measures have been taken by State for expediting
utilization of sanctioned funds. The regular efforts are being made to eradicate
/minimize the local disputes in implementation of watershed projects and reviews of
districts are being taken rigorously on weekly basis.

#### Harvana:

- The State informed that due to the imposition of the Model Code of Conduct twice during the Lok Sabha and Vidhan Sabha elections in FY 2024-25, the pace of fund utilization was hampered. The State is now holding weekly video conferences (VCs) with CEOs/ASCOs-cum-PIAs/TEs to accelerate the implementation of watershed works.
- State is advised to revise the strategy for FY 2025-26 action plan.

# Himachal Pradesh:

- The state has taken remedial measures to expedite the utilization of sanctioned funds and assignment of expenditure targets for all project areas and daily monitoring of progress against these targets.
- Regular video conferences and review meetings have been organized with PIAs to expedite the progress of works and expenditure.

#### Jharkhand:

- State informed that bills amounting to Rs.10 crore are in hand for submission.
- Transition from SNA to SNA-SPARSH system took time for on boarding of staff to the new system. For on boarding, training on SNA-SPARSH system has been conducted at state level and all finance and accounts officers have attended the same.
- The State is regularly holding the Video Conferences (VCs) with PIAs to accelerate the implementation of watershed works.

## **Karnataka**

- The progress of State (91.8%) under WDC-PMKSY 2.0 was appreciated.
- CEO, SLNA made presentation on the Digital Library, Portal and Decision Support System developed under REWARD program as a best practice.

#### Kerala

- The State informed that land is not available for large-scale horticultural plantations, as the majority of farmers are small and marginal. Accordingly, the State has revised the DPR through the SLNA, included alternative works in the DPR, and planned assistance for plantations customized to the needs of small farmers.
- State made a presentation on the technological application of Automatic Weather Stations for Scientific Watershed planning & implementation as a best practice.

# Madhya Pradesh:

- For promoting of farm diversification through cluster based vegetable production in Kharif and Rabi season of Year 2025, there is a plan to spend Rs. 40 crore on this activity.
- State is advised to involve the community along with corporates under Janbhagidari Cup.

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 State presented use of AI and DSS under watershed development developed by SLNA (in-house) as a best practice, which was well appreciated.

## Maharashtra:

- The man power and other related issues got resolved and the State assured better progress in the coming months.
- The Chief Secretary, Government of Maharashtra, has also reviewed the progress of WDC-PMKSY 2.0 in a meeting with collectors and issued instructions to take the necessary measures to improve progress.
- JS(WM) appreciated use of drip irrigation in sugarcane farms through farm ponds.
- A total of 308 NGOs are involved in implementing the capacity building component, and recently appointed 6 NGOs as PIAs in lagging projects.
- State ensured to cross expenditure of Rs. 100 crore by May, 2025. JS(WM) requested to submit the detailed plan in this regard.
- State has planned extensively under Janbhagidari.

#### Manipur:

- The state informed that it has been facing law and order issues for quite some time.
- The RBI account has already been opened, and the SNA SPARSH system will be operational by the first week of May 2025.
- Regular review meetings have been organized with PIAs to expedite the progress of works and expenditure.

#### Meghalaya:

- The state informed that on boarding on SNA SPARSH have been completed.
- The Annual Action Plan for FY 2025-26 for approval by Chairman SLSC have been submitted on file and proposal for release of corresponding State Share which has been processed and followed up closely for early release.
- State is asked to revise the month-wise expenditure action plan with a proportionately higher expenditure plan during the initial months.
- State is advised to organize an exposure visit to Maharashtra and Rajasthan to encourage local NGOs to take up works under Janbhagidari.

# Mizoram:

- The state informed that they have initiated remedial measures for expediting utilization of sanctioned funds and SLNA took necessary actions for transfer of Project Fund from State Treasury to SNA.
- · State also stated that SNA SPARSH has already been mapped.

# Nagaland:

- The state informed that SNA Sparsh is yet to be implemented in the state as the IFMIS application is on trial by the State Treasury.
- State also stated that SNA unspent balance as of 31<sup>st</sup> march 2025 will be returned to the Consolidated Fund of India (CFI) and Consolidated Fund of the State.
- Being a hilly State, JS (WM) advised the State to plan for more durable structures.

#### Odisha:

- State also informed that project-wise Action Plan for the FY2025-26 have been prepared to utilise the remaining project funds by March 2026.
- State is advised to target higher amount under Janbhagidari Cup.

#### Punjab:

- The State informed that due to the imposition of the Model Code of Conduct during the Lok Sabha election in FY 2024-25 and major flooding during 2023 the pace of fund utilization was hampered.
- State also informed that Annual Action Plan for the FY2025-26 has already been approved to utilise the remaining project funds by March'2026.
- JS (WM) expressed dissatisfaction about the poor progress and non responsiveness of SLNA. Secretary, DoLR suggested the State to focus on the expenditure of WDC-PMKSY 2.0 instead of raising funds through CSR through Janbhagidari. Further, he advised the State to focus on Shramdaan in the villages for Janbhagidari Cup.

#### Rajasthan:

- State informed that during first two years progress was very low due to some administrative issues.
- State also informed about the issues of SNA Sparsh/ PFMS regarding non-reflection of State invoices in Central PFMS. The State is advised to contact PFMS team in New Delhi for resolution.
- The State presented effective use of farm ponds and its replication across State as a best practice.

#### Sikkim:

- CEO, SLNA stated that States topography and fragile hill slopes necessitate that
  major physical works be timed carefully to avoid landslides or damage. The postmonsoon period (October-November) was largely dedicated to field assessments and
  community re-engagement, while actual ground execution was temporarily limited in
  several sites due to accessibility issues or unstable conditions.
- They are also confident that the pace of expenditure will pick up significantly with the onset of the working season and once procurement cycles are completed.
- State was advised to organize a training of SNA Sparsh in the coming week.

# Tamil Nadu

- The performance of the State was appreciated.
- State informed that bills amounting to Rs.5 crore are in hand for submission.

# Telangana:

- Secretary, DoLR expressed his displeasure for not issuing work order for 3000 works and requested to expedite the same.
- The state has stated that it has taken remedial measures to expedite the utilization of sanctioned funds. It also informed that the state has already been on boarded onto the SPARSH mode. Payments are being made regularly. Monthly targets have been assigned to field officers, and regular reviews are being conducted with district-level officers.
- State requested detailed protocols for spineless cactus cultivation under the scheme.

## Tripura:

- State made presentation on cultivation of Dragon fruit in the State as a best practice.
- The performance of the State was appreciated.

# **Uttar Pradesh**

• The State has stated that due to delays in the selection of PIAs and the constitution of WDT teams by the PIAs, the progress of the scheme in the State was very slow. However, all PIAs are now functioning properly, and WDT teams have been constituted and trained, resulting in positive outcomes being observed in the field.

## Uttarakhand:

- As per available budget by 1<sup>st</sup> mother sanctioned during CFY, the budget will be utilized by15<sup>th</sup> June 2025.
- State to provide action plan for additional Rs. 24 crore which is left out in the action plan for the CFY2025-26.

#### West Bengal:

- The pace of fund utilization is slow in the State due to the imposition of the Model Code of Conduct during the Lok Sabha and Panchayat elections.
- As part of the remedial measures taken by the State to expedite the utilization of sanctioned funds, the execution of works in collaboration with non-PIAs (i.e., various line departments) has been planned, and the implementation of works in forest and fringe areas will be expedited.

# Jammu & Kashmir (UT):

- The CEO of the UT stated that the implementation of projects was hampered twice due to the Model Code of Conduct, both times during the peak working season.
- The CEO also stated that the engagement of contractual staff working at the project level has been sub Judice before the Hon'ble High Court since the inception of WDC-PMKSY 2.0. Further, he stated that there is 60% staff shortage which is hindering the project progress.
- The UT has stated that it has taken remedial measures to expedite the utilization of sanctioned funds and has requested the timely initiation of the WDC-PMKSY 3.0 phase.
- The UT presented the best practice of construction of RCC Irrigation Canal to control the run-off.

# Ladakh (UT)

- UT stated that WDC-PMKSY 2.0 started 2 years late, which is one of the reason for poor progress, in addition to 6-7 months of permafrost wherein none of the activities can be implemented.
- The SLNA and SLCC meeting is scheduled for 25/04/2025, and it is expected to provide momentum to the works slated for approval. This year's work plan for Kargil district is proposed at ₹11.53 crore, and for Leh district at ₹8.40 crore.
- Proposal for the first tranche of CFY 2025-26 is expected to be submitted in the second week of May.
- More concerted efforts will be undertaken to complete the works during the current working season.

 Mobilization of both financial and human resources will be prioritized during these months, which constitute the working season for the Union Territory of Ladakh.

Commitment made by States/UTs for expenditure during current financial year is given at Annexure -II.

- 6. After the State/UT-wise review, the following renowned NGOs/Institute, already involved in watershed development activities, gave their presentations:
  - i. NAAM Foundation on the subject "Community mobilization for soil and water conservation"
  - ii. Dr. Ujjwalkumar Chavan, Wari Foundation on the subject "Transforming Water Landscape of Rural Maharashtra through Community Collaboration"
  - iii. ICIMOD, Scaling Springshed management: ICIMOD's strategy and approach

The Joint Secretary (WM), DoLR, provided concluding remarks and requested all the States/UTs to make note of all the points discussed during the review meeting and expedite the progress as per their respective action plans in order to achieve the desired progress and the results within the given timelines under WDC-PMKSY 2.0. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks.
